EXECUTIVE PROCLAMATION

I, Mary Fallin, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, pursuant to the authority vested in me by 2 O.S. Section 16-26(A), do hereby proclaim that after careful review of the current and predicted wildland fire conditions, recent fire behavior, and wildland fire occurrence, the ban on outdoor burning is canceled for the following the following 53 counties:

Adair, Atoka, Canadian, Carter, Cherokee, Choctaw, Cleveland, Coal, Craig, Creek, Delaware, Garfield, Garvin, Grady, Grant, Haskell, Hughes, Jefferson, Johnston, Kay, Kingfisher, Latimer, LeFlore, Lincoln, Logan, Love, McClain, McCurtain, McIntosh, Marshall, Mayes, Murray, Muskogee, Noble, Nowata, Okfuskee, Oklahoma, Okmulgee, Osage, Ottawa, Pawnee, Payne, Pittsburg, Pontotoc, Pottawatomie, Pushmataha, Rogers, Seminole, Sequoyah, Stephens, Tulsa, Wagoner, Washington.

The Forestry Services Division is hereby directed to publish or post copies of this proclamation in order to provide adequate notice to affected citizens as required by 2 O.S. Section 16-26. It is further directed to distribute copies of this proclamation to the Department of Public Safety, the Department of Tourism and Recreation, the State Fire Marshal, the Office of the South Central Interstate Forest Fire Protection Compact, all Cabinet Secretaries, and the Sheriffs of all affected counties listed above.

This proclamation cancels and terminates the Executive Proclamations issued on Friday, February 10, 2017, which prevented outdoor burning in 53 counties.
