WHEREAS, social workers have helped craft national policies for social security, civil rights, disability rights, child protection, fair pay, mental health parity, and numerous other programs that support Oklahoma families; and

WHEREAS, the practice of social work requires knowledge of human development and behavior, of social, economic and cultural institutions, and of the interaction of all these factors; and

WHEREAS, social workers provide education and invaluable experience to lead individuals, families, and entire communities through intricate social issues and life choices in order to enhance human well-being and promote empowerment and self-determination; and

WHEREAS, social workers permeate all facets of society, from hospitals to schools, from group homes to mental health clinics, and consistently strive to develop, promote and improve methods of care and best practices; and

WHEREAS, social workers delve into a myriad of public services in the interests of social justice by participating in activities such as community organization, consultation administration, advocacy, social and political action, policy development and implementation, education, and research and evaluation; and

WHEREAS, social workers are committed to a mission of great purpose to create infinite possibilities for future generations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 52ND OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:


THAT the Oklahoma State Senate applauds and supports the goals and ideals of social workers in this state.
