SUBJECT: Falsifying documents relating to deprived child
proceedings

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-8-110 of Title 10A, unless
there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Any member of law enforcement, state employee, employee of a
private employer, or any other individual that appears in a deprived
child proceeding who knowingly and intentionally falsifies any
document containing a material fact in any case in which a child has
been alleged or adjudicated deprived that results in the great
bodily harm or the death of the child shall, upon conviction, be
guilty of a felony punishable by a fine of One Thousand Dollars
(\$1,000.00) or by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of
Corrections for up to two (2) years or by both such fine and
imprisonment.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2012.
