A Concurrent Resolution praising the cooperative efforts of local and federal law enforcement agencies and city leaders in the response to the shooting rampage that occurred on Friday, April 6, in north Tulsa; expressing condolences to the families of those killed and hopes for a swift recovery for survivors; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, in the early hours of Friday, April 6, 2012, three people were killed and two others injured after a series of shootings in north Tulsa, leaving citizens throughout Tulsa, the state of Oklahoma, and the nation shocked and horrified; and

WHEREAS, law enforcement from the Tulsa Police Department, the Tulsa County Sheriff's Office, the Oklahoma Highway Patrol, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives, and U.S. Marshals demonstrated professionalism and cooperation throughout the crime investigation; and

WHEREAS, members of the law enforcement community and Tulsa city leaders, including Police Chief Chuck Jordan, Mayor Dewey Bartlett, and City Councilman Jack Henderson assisted in keeping the community informed of law enforcement efforts and reassured citizens those responsible would be found and arrested; and

WHEREAS, within 24 hours of the formation of the task force "Operation Random Shooter" citizens provided Crime Stoppers with tips leading to Sunday's arrest of two suspects.



THAT the Oklahoma Legislature expresses condolences to the families of Friday's shootings and offers prayers for recovery for the two citizens who were injured.


THAT a copy of this resolution be distributed to those involved law enforcement agencies, Chief Jordan, Mayor Bartlett and Councilman Henderson.
