An Act relating to state government; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section 3601.2, as last amended by Section 35 of Enrolled House Bill No. 2201 of the 1st Session of the 54th Oklahoma Legislature, which relates to salaries for chief executive officers; modifying provisions related to salary amounts; requiring salaries to be set between certain minimum and maximum amounts; providing for reference to annual compensation reports; requiring recommendations by Office of Management and Enterprise Services; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section 150.6a, which relates to salaries for certain positions with the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation; modifying provision related to salary of the Director; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SUBJECT: State executive officers salaries

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 3601.2, as last amended by Section 35 of Enrolled House Bill No. 2201 of the 1st Session of the 54th Oklahoma Legislature, is amended to read as follows:

Section 3601.2 A. Beginning ~~January 1, 2010~~ July 1, 2013, the each agency, board, commission, department or program in the executive branch of state government shall establish the salary of

each of the chief executive officers for which they have appointing authority. Such salary shall be set between the minimum and maximum of the range specified below in the annual compensation reports required by paragraph 5 of Section 840-1.6A of this title, for full-time employees only, ~~per annum, payable monthly, pursuant to the limitations outlined below:~~

~~1. If the chief executive officer's salary is below the minimum annual salary then it can not be raised to more than the minimum annual salary in one (1) fiscal year. If the chief executive officer's salary is at or above the minimum annual salary then the salary may not be increased above the midpoint in one (1) fiscal year;~~

~~2. Such increases shall not occur more than once in a fiscal year; and~~

~~3. The salary of the incumbent chief executive officer shall not be increased if the officer's salary exceeds the maximum of the range.~~

B. All increases require certification of the appointing authority that said action can be implemented for the current fiscal year and subsequent fiscal year without the need for additional funding. The agency, board, commission, department or program shall report increases granted under this section to the Office of

Management and Enterprise Services on an annual basis by August 1 of each year. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall forward a report of such increases to the Governor, President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and Speaker of the House of Representatives no later than September 1 of each year.

C. ~~Every two (2) years starting FY-05~~ three (3) years beginning with fiscal year 2013, the Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall review these salary ranges and report on and make recommendations on proposed salary ranges in ~~their~~ its annual compensation reports mandated by paragraph 5 of Section 840-1.6A of this title ~~by~~. Such recommendations shall be made no later than December 1 February 1 for chief executive officers in all state agencies, boards, commissions, departments or programs in the executive branch of state government, including but not limited to those specified in Section 3601.1 of this title.

~~D. Every three (3) years the Legislature shall review the salary ranges specified in subsection A of this section.~~

SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 150.6a, is amended to read as follows:

Section 150.6a A. Effective July 1, 2004, the annual salaries for the Deputy Director, and the positions within the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, as set out in this section, shall be in accordance and conformity with the following salary schedule, exclusive of longevity pay as authorized by Section 840-2.18 of this title:

1. Deputy Director:

The salary of the Deputy Director shall be ninety-five percent (95%) of that received by the Director;

2. Division Director:

The salary of a Division Director shall be ninety percent (90%) of that received by the Director;

3. Agent I (OSBI), Criminalist I:

Minimum \$33,500.00, Mid-point \$41,875.00,
Maximum \$50,250.00;

4. Agent II (OSBI), Criminalist II:

Minimum \$39,250.00, Mid-point \$49,062.00,
Maximum \$58,875.00;

5. Agent III (OSBI), Criminalist III:

Minimum \$46,250.00, Mid-point \$57,812.00,
Maximum \$69,375.00;

6. Agent IV (OSBI), Criminalist IV:

Minimum \$51,000.00, Mid-point \$63,750.00,
Maximum \$76,500.00; and

7. Agent V (OSBI), Criminalist V:

Minimum \$56,000.00, Mid-point \$70,000.00,
Maximum \$84,000.00.

B. Effective July 1, 2004, positions allocated to the agent and criminalist job families may receive additional compensation through the use of pay mechanisms provided for in the Oklahoma Personnel Act and the Merit System of Personnel Administration Rules.

C. Effective January 1, ~~2007~~ 2013, the annual salaries for the Deputy Director, and the positions within the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, as set out in this section, shall be in accordance and conformity with the following salary schedule, exclusive of longevity pay as authorized by Section 840-2.18 of this title:

The salary of the Deputy Director shall be ninety-five percent (95%) of that received by the Director;

2. Division Director:

The salary of a Division Director shall be ninety percent (90%) of that received by the Director;

Minimum \$40,778.00, Mid-point \$49,153.00,

4. Agent II (OSBI), Criminalist II:

Minimum \$46,260.00, Mid-point \$56,072.00,
Maximum \$65,885.00;

Provided, however, no such employee shall receive less than the salary the employee received on December 31, 2006.

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2013.

SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
