A Resolution commemorating the 100th anniversary of
YWCA Tulsa; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, on December 2, 2014, YWCA Tulsa will celebrate the centennial anniversary of the organization's efforts to promote peace, justice, freedom and dignity for all; and

WHEREAS, since its founding in 1914, YWCA Tulsa has been an integral part of community efforts to serve the needs of women and their families in the Tulsa area; and

WHEREAS, YWCA Tulsa's efforts to eliminate racism and empower women stretch back to the community's greatest tragedy. In 1921, after their own building was burned during the Tulsa Race Riot, YWCA

Tulsa opened a center in north Tulsa to offer shelter, support and the basic necessities of life for African-American women left homeless by the riot; and

WHEREAS, during the Great Depression, YWCA Tulsa helped numerous women and their families cope in an era of tremendous scarcity and suffering; and

WHEREAS, YWCA Tulsa today carries forward this tradition of inclusion and empowerment through programs and advocacy in health and wellness, immigrant and refugee services, racial justice, women's empowerment and inclusion training that provide opportunity and assistance for Tulsans; and


WHEREAS, YWCA Tulsa remains committed to helping Tulsans succeed through wellness, wealth and education.
