

## Proclamation

Whereas, Enoch Kelly Haney has made many contributions to the State of Oklahoma, the Seminole Nation and the world at large as an artist, legislator and tribal leader; and

Whereas, Enoch Kelly Haney is an internationally recognized Native American artist who has exhibited his works throughout the United States, England, Switzerland, Malaysia, Singapore, and South Korea; and

Whereas, Enoch Kelly Haney is a Master Artist of the Civilized Tribes and is the esteemed creator of the 22-foot bronze sculpture entitled "The Guardian" that adorns the Oklahoma State Capitol dome; and

Whereas, Enoch Kelly Haney was the first full blood American Indian to serve in the Oklahoma Legislature. He served for 22 years with six years in the House of Representatives and 16 years in the State Senate; and

Whereas, Enoch Kelly Haney has been a strong advocate for public education, the development of the American Indian Cultural Center and for the working women and men of Oklahoma; and

Whereas, Enoch Kelly Haney served as Principal Chief of the Seminole Nation of Oklahoma for four years and has also served the Seminole Nation as a councilman, bank chief, business consultant, and planner;

Now, therefore, I, Brad Henry, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, do hereby proclaim September 28, 2010, as

**"Enoch Kelly Haney Day"**

in the State of Oklahoma.
