

Proclamation

Whereas, the United Nations adopted the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, on December 10, 1948, an effort aimed at securing basic human rights for the people of all nations; and

Whereas, the United States was founded on the principle that the individual has immeasurable dignity and worth; and

Whereas, the United States has continually reaffirmed its faith in the fundamental freedoms and human rights of all Americans; and

Whereas, the State of Oklahoma has also adopted the basic tenets of human rights as the foundation of citizenship for its people and has historically contributed to advancing the cause of human rights in our nation; and

Whereas, the State of Oklahoma reveres its human resources, respects and promotes the human rights of its citizens, and dedicates itself to ensuring that each Oklahoman is free to utilize his or her talents to reach their greatest potential;

Now, therefore, I, Brad Henry, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, do hereby proclaim the week of December 5 – 11, 2010, as

"Human Rights Week"

in the State of Oklahoma, and urge all Oklahomans to recognize the importance of human rights to all of its citizens.
