

Proclamation

Whereas, Larry D. Stuart was elected District Attorney of Osage and Pawnee Counties in 1978 and has served in such capacity since that time, winning re-election unopposed; and

Whereas, he has served as Director of the Osage/Pawnee County Drug Task Force since 1987; and

Whereas, from 1980 – 1982 he served as Director for the Oklahoma District Attorneys Association; and

Whereas, in 1983 he was elected President of the Oklahoma District Attorneys Association, during which tenure he served as Chairman of the District Attorneys Training Coordination Council; and

Whereas, he has been cooperative and made his office available for service to the Attorney General of Oklahoma conducting grand juries at the request of the same in Ottawa County and in Washington County, his office at the request of the Attorney General has taken on the successful defense of numerous Section 1983 Federal Civil Rights lawsuits involving counties outside his district; and

Whereas, during his first term of office the first jury-imposed death penalty since Statehood was assessed against a defendant in Osage County, he later personally prosecuted the second jury-imposed death penalty case in Osage County and the defendant was executed in July 1999; and

Whereas, he has successfully prosecuted many criminal cases which include, drug cases, violent crimes, child molestation and two jury-imposed death penalty cases;

Now, therefore, I, Brad Henry, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, do hereby proclaim, December 15, 2010, as

"Larry D. Stuart Day"

in the State of Oklahoma.
