

Proclamation

Whereas, Lynch Syndrome is a genetic form of colon cancer; and

Whereas, Lynch Syndrome can be identified through genetic testing; and

Whereas, Lynch Syndrome is most likely to occur in family members less than 50 years old; and

Whereas, colon cancers are preventable if detected early; and

Whereas, Lynch Syndrome identification and knowledge can prevent colon cancer through careful surveillance and screening; and

Whereas, if colon cancer runs in your family or has afflicted someone you know, who is less than 50 years old, genetic testing can determine if you are a carrier;

Now, therefore, I, Mary Fallin, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, do hereby proclaim March 22, 2012 as

"Lynch Syndrome Public Awareness Day"

in the State of Oklahoma.
