

Proclamation

Whereas, geologic maps are fundamental to society; and

Whereas, geologic maps are integral to finding, developing and conserving minerals, energy, building materials, and water resources needed for society as well as developing and preserving recreational areas; and

Whereas, geologic maps provide the basis for preparing and mitigating natural hazards such as floods, landslides, earthquakes, sinkholes, and erosion; and

Whereas, geologic maps are crucial to environmental and ecological issues ranging from water and air quality to waste disposal; and

Whereas, geologic maps of resources, hazards, and structures are vital to land management and land use decisions at local, state, regional, national, international, and global levels; and

Whereas, geologic maps provide critical information to enhance our understanding of the earth and the use and conservation of Oklahoma's natural resources;

Now, therefore, I, Mary Fallin, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, do hereby proclaim October 19, 2012 as

"Geologic Map Day"

in the State of Oklahoma.
