Whereas, the Oklahoma Association of Student Councils serves as an ideal opportunity to bring attention to the important and integral contributions that student leaders and leadership training makes in our nation's schools; and

Whereas, each year the Oklahoma Association of Student Councils hosts its State Convention at different schools across the state and Pryor High School in Pryor, Oklahoma has been selected and given the opportunity to host this extraordinary event;

Now, therefore, I, Mary Fallin, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, do hereby proclaim November 3rd through November 5th, 2012 as

“Oklahoma Association of Student Councils Days”

in the State of Oklahoma.
