

Proclamation

Whereas, the Colonial Williamsburg teachers and their students desired to celebrate our colonial heritage by having a Colonial Day at the Capitol; and

Whereas, George Mason, as author of America's first bill of rights, has penned such needed reminders that "by frequent recurrence to fundamental principles" we build character and provide effective citizenship and training; and

Whereas, we the people value the elective process as essential to our life, liberty, and pursuit of happiness, and to safeguard our freedoms;

Now, therefore, I, Mary Fallin, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, do hereby proclaim February 1, 2013 as

"Colonial Day at the Capitol"

in the State of Oklahoma and do hereby declare the Colonial Williamsburg teachers and their students in colonial session for the day.
