

Proclamation

Whereas, the climate of the state of Oklahoma is conducive to the development of natural and possibly manmade emergencies and disasters; and

Whereas, since 2007 Oklahoma has received 30 presidential disaster declarations representing more than \$423 million in infrastructure damage and millions more in private property damage delivered by ice and snow storms, tornadoes, flooding, and other severe weather; and

Whereas, the citizens of the state of Oklahoma are adversely affected by such emergencies and disasters; and

Whereas, it is vital that we further our awareness of the dangers of such disasters and the protective measures citizens can take in the event of such conditions; and

Whereas, Oklahoma Emergency Managers are responsible for encouraging and assisting state and local officials to plan adequately for and respond effectively to such emergencies and disasters; and

Whereas, Oklahoma Emergency Managers follow a comprehensive emergency management plan involving preparedness, response, recovery and mitigation areas; and

Whereas, the Oklahoma Emergency Management Association should be commended for its continued diligence and mission to the citizens of Oklahoma;

Now, therefore, I, Mary Fallin, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, do hereby proclaim the week of February 24th through March 2nd, 2013 as

"Oklahoma Emergency Management Week"

in the State of Oklahoma.
