

Proclamation

Whereas, the emergency medical services system for metropolitan Oklahoma City and Tulsa has achieved a calendar year 2012 sudden cardiac arrest survival rate of 45.2 percent, with more than 90 percent of these represented patients surviving neurologically intact, returning to active work and enjoyment of life; and

Whereas, this achievement reflects the critically important roles that the 1.2 million Oklahoma residents and visitors, which this system serves, contribute in immediately recognizing sudden cardiac arrest, summoning emergency medical care by calling 911, and in providing CPR until emergency medical professionals arrive; and

Whereas, this accomplishment illustrates the life-saving dedication and skill of more than 3,700 emergency medical professionals working around the clock in enthusiastic teamwork in the Emergency Medical Services Authority (EMSA) and in the fire departments of Oklahoma City, Tulsa, Edmond, Yukon, Bixby, Bethany, Sand Springs, Mustang, Jenks, Keystone, The Village, Warr Acres, Nichols Hills, Piedmont, Jones, Berryhill, Valley Brook, Luther, Arcadia, Deer Creek, Lake Aluma, Oak Cliff and Will Rogers Airport; and

Whereas, this sudden cardiac arrest survival achievement is an all-time high for this emergency medical services system, is approximately five-fold the national sudden cardiac arrest survival rate, serve as a role model for other systems in the United States and around the world, and further inspires the emergency medical services system for metropolitan Oklahoma City and Tulsa and its professionals in their life-saving work;

Now, therefore, I, Mary Fallin, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, do hereby proclaim March 2014 as

"Sudden Cardiac Arrest Survival Rate Month"

in the state of Oklahoma.
