

Proclamation

Whereas, over 1,650 Americans are still missing from the Vietnam War, nearly 8,000 unaccounted for from the Korean War, 120 from the Cold War, approximately 75,000 from WWII, and one POW in Afghanistan; and

Whereas, many of their families, friends and other concerned Americans still must deal with uncertainty concerning their fates; and

Whereas, the Obama Administration recently has reinforced its commitment to maintaining POW/MIA accounting as a priority of the United States, though concerns remain about adequate funding and personnel; and

Whereas, the United States Government intelligence and other evidence indicate that most countries in which United States losses occurred could provide greater assistance to answer questions about missing Americans;

Now, therefore, I, Mary Fallin, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, do hereby proclaim September 19th, 2014 as

"POW/MIA Recognition Day"

in the state of Oklahoma.

In Witness Whereof, I have herunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Oklahoma to be affixed.



Done at the Capitol, in the City of Oklahoma City, this 7th day of July, in the Year of Our Lord two thousand and fourteen, and of the State of Oklahoma in the one hundred and sixth year.
