

Proclamation

Whereas, the state of Oklahoma recognizes their vital role in identifying, protecting, and responding to cyber threats that may significantly impact our individual and collective security and privacy; and

Whereas, critical infrastructure sectors are increasingly reliant on information systems to support financial services, energy, telecommunications, transportation, utilities, healthcare, and emergency response systems; and

Whereas, the Stop.Think.Connect.™ Campaign has been designated as the National Public Awareness Campaign, implemented through a coalition of private companies, nonprofit and government organizations, and academic institutions aimed at increasing the understanding of cyber threats and empowering the American public to be safer and more secure online; and

Whereas, the National Institute for Standards and Technology Cybersecurity Framework and the Department of Homeland Security's Critical Infrastructure Cyber Community (C3) Voluntary Program have been developed as a free resource to help organizations (large and small, both public and private) implement the Cybersecurity Framework and improve their cyber practices through a practical approach to addressing evolving threats and challenges; and

Whereas, maintaining the security of cyberspace is a shared responsibility in which we each play a critical role, and awareness of computer security essentials will improve the security of Oklahoma's information infrastructure and economy; and

Whereas, the United States Department of Homeland Security, the CIS/Multi-State Information Sharing and Analysis Center, the National Association of State Chief Information Officers and the National Cyber Security Alliance encourage all citizens to learn about cyber security and put that knowledge into practice in their homes, school, and workplaces;

Now, therefore, I, Mary Fallin, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, do hereby proclaim the month of October 2014 as

"Cyber Security Awareness Month"

in the state of Oklahoma.
