

## Proclamation

*Whereas, more than thirty-two thousand lives are lost each year in car accidents on American highways and roads. Many of these fatal car crashes might be avoided by simply exercising patience, caution, and awareness on the roads; and*

*Whereas, drivers should prepare themselves for the unpredictable behaviors of other drivers, disabled vehicles, spilled cargo, adverse weather conditions, and many other potential dangers they may encounter on roadways. Remaining focused allows motorists to react quickly and correctly in any situation; and*

*Whereas, it is always important for drivers to focus on driving, eliminate distractions, maintain safe speeds, and drive defensively to avoid preventable accidents; and*

*Whereas, many individuals and organizations in Oklahoma are working to increase awareness of the need for driver safety; and*

*Whereas, traditionally the Sunday after Thanksgiving is the busiest highway travel day of the year and all Oklahomans are encouraged to focus on driving in a safe manner;*

*Now, therefore, I, Mary Fallin, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, do hereby proclaim November 30, 2014 as*

### *“Drive Safer Sunday”*

*in the state of Oklahoma.*
