

Proclamation

Whereas, epilepsy is a neurological disorder producing brief disturbances in the normal electrical functions of the brain that temporarily affects a person's consciousness, body movement; sensation awareness, and behavior, while creating long-term effects on the lifestyle of the individual with epilepsy; and

Whereas, one in twenty-six people will develop epilepsy and one in ten people will have a seizure in their lifetime; and

Whereas, epilepsy can affect anyone no matter their gender, race, age, religion, educational background or socioeconomic status; and

Whereas, epilepsy is more common than Parkinson's disease, multiple sclerosis, muscular dystrophy, and cerebral palsy combined; and

Whereas, epilepsy affects more than sixty-five million people worldwide; and

Whereas, epilepsy is a complex disorder that requires further research to find a cure and prevention; and

Whereas, the annual observance of Epilepsy Awareness Month advocates for the rights, humane treatment, and appropriate education of all people with epilepsy, while raising public awareness for the disorder;

Now, therefore, I, Mary Fallin, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, do hereby proclaim November 2014 as

"Epilepsy Awareness Month"

in the state of Oklahoma.
