

Proclamation

Whereas, since the year following the Oklahoma Land Run, members of First Presbyterian Church of Edmond have been faithful to God, His mission and the citizens of Edmond, to whom they have been called to both love and serve; and

Whereas, a small group of settlers met on March 2, 1890, in the territorial school house to hear the first sermon preached in Edmond by a Presbyterian minister; and

Whereas, that little white frame building is the only structure from the church's past that still stands in its original location on Second Street just west of Boulevard; and

Whereas, with a membership of 318 parishioners in the 1950's, the church had the foresight to purchase land at Ninth and Rankin where long-range plans were birthed for future growth; and

Whereas, for 125 years, the members of First Presbyterian Church of Edmond have served the church, their communities, and the world at large through the sharing of God's word and the allocation of their time, talents, and resources;

Now, therefore, I, Mary Fallin, Governor of the state of Oklahoma, do hereby proclaim May 31, 2015, as

"First Presbyterian Church of Edmond Day"

in the state of Oklahoma.
