Proclamation

Whereas, Faver High School was established in Guthrie, Oklahoma for Negro students; and
Whereas, the first school building, located on Grant Street, was donated by and named for County Commissioner, Stonewall J. Faver; and
Whereas, Faver High School's first class graduated in 1908 and the last class graduated in 1967 under principal Anderson Tipton; and
Whereas, the majority of Faver graduates became productive individuals with several obtaining advanced college degrees; and
Whereas, in keeping with the alumni association's mission, alumni provide legacy scholarships for their descendants attending Langston University; and
Whereas, the association also offers financial support and mentoring to Faver progeny who attend other institutions of higher learning; and
Whereas, the vision of Faver High School Alumni Association is dedicated to sustaining the heritage of the school through unity and consistent educational opportunities for its descendants;

Now, therefore, I, Mary Fallin, Governor, do hereby proclaim July 18th, 2015, as

"Faver High School Remembrance Day"

in the state of Oklahoma and call upon alumni to observe the day with appropriate programs and activities.
