Whereas, Stevens Johnson Syndrome (SJS) and Toxic Epidermal Necrolysis (TEN) are severe idiosyncratic reactions, most commonly triggered by medications; and

Whereas, more than 100 medications, including over the counter drugs, can cause SJS; and

Whereas, SJS affects people of all ages, but it usually occurs in children; and

Whereas, recognizing the early symptoms of SJS and obtaining medical attention are the best tools for minimizing the possible long term effects of the disorder; and


