

Proclamation

Whereas, an estimated 20 million American workers use respirators every day to protect against potential job hazards in occupations that include first-responders, medical professionals, coal miners and agriculture employees; and

Whereas, many of these people depend on particulate filtering face piece respirators when working in environments with hazardous airborne particles; and

Whereas, part of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH), is the federal agency responsible for testing and approving personal protective equipment; and

Whereas, this agency has established N95 Day to emphasize the importance of properly using NIOSH-approved N95 filtering face piece respirators; and

Whereas, NIOSH-approved N95 filtering face piece respirators filter 95% of particles and significantly reduce the wearer's risk of inhaling hazardous airborne particles from dangerous chemicals, dust, metal fumes and many infectious diseases;

Now, therefore, I, Mary Fallin, Governor, do hereby proclaim September 4, 2015, as

"N95 Day"

in the state of Oklahoma.
