

Whereas, born in Tulsa, Oklahoma, Olivia spent her youth calling our country's heartland her home; and

Whereas, throughout the last four years, Olivia has become an advocate for the Alzheimer's Association, a cause her family has been passionate about for over 30 years; and

Whereas, Olivia served as the 2015 Oklahoma Chapter Alzheimer's Association Memory Gala host, where she proudly declared 2 million dollars raised in Oklahoma; and

Whereas, Olivia is an advocate for Children of the Night, an organization that is devoted to getting children out of prostitution; and

Whereas, Oklahoma is delighted that our Olivia will be representing both Oklahoma and the USA later this year in the 65th Annual MISS UNIVERSE Pageant;

Now, therefore, I, Mary Fallin, Governor, do hereby proclaim Tuesday, September 22, 2015, as

"Miss USA Olivia Jordan Day"

in the state of Oklahoma.
