Proclamation

Whereas, healthcare facilities employ dedicated professionals who advocate for improving health and promote patient and staff safety in order to minimize and prevent infections; and

Whereas, improved health practices, such as thorough hand washing, sterilization, and aftercare can significantly reduce the risk and occurrence of infections; and

Whereas, preventing healthcare-associated infections helps reduce human suffering and the burdensome cost of treatments; and

Whereas, Infection Prevention Week recognizes the thousands of healthcare workers educating individuals on proper infection prevention techniques, and is an opportunity to reduce infections through increased awareness;

Now, therefore, I, Mary Fallin, Governor, do hereby proclaim October 18 through October 24, 2015, as

"Infection Prevention Week"

in the state of Oklahoma.
