

Proclamation

Whereas, Martin Luther King, Jr. was born eighty-seven years ago, on January 15, 1929, in Atlanta, Georgia; and

Whereas, Martin Luther King, Jr. was a visionary leader who devoted his life to the advancement of civil rights and was deeply committed to achieving social justice through nonviolent means; and

Whereas, Martin Luther King, Jr. was bestowed a dream, founded within the framework of our nation's most sacred principles, of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness; and

Whereas, Martin Luther King, Jr. inspired Americans to share his vision of a nation where all people can live and work together in a "beautiful symphony of brotherhood" and are judged, "by the content of their character"; and


Whereas, Martin Luther King, Jr. was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1964, for his diplomatic resistance to racial prejudice;

Now, therefore, I, Mary Fallin, Governor, do hereby proclaim January 18, 2016, as

"Martin Luther King, Jr. Day"

in the state of Oklahoma and encourage all citizens to honor Dr. King's memory and celebrate his legacy through service to the community.
