

Proclamation

Whereas, hundreds of people die and thousands are injured each year in electrical accidents, according to the International Association of Electrical Inspectors; and

Whereas, property damage resulting from home fires triggered by electrical failure or malfunction amount to more than \$1.4 billion annually; and

Whereas, following basic electrical safety precautions can prevent injury or even death by electrocution; and

Whereas, residents are encouraged to test their smoke detectors and ground fault circuit interrupters monthly and after every major electrical storm; and

Whereas, Oklahoma residents are advised to protect their homes and families with the latest safety technology; and

Whereas, the Electrical Safety Foundation International (ESFI) is dedicated exclusively to promoting electrical safety in the home, school and workplace through education, awareness and advocacy;

Now, therefore, I, Mary Fallin, Governor, do hereby proclaim May 2016 as

“Electrical Safety Month”

in the state of Oklahoma.
