

# Proclamation

**Whereas**, Wolf-Hirschhorn Syndrome, also known as 4p-, is a chromosomal disorder caused by a partial deletion of the short arm of chromosome number 4; and

**Whereas**, children with 4p-syndrome typically experience a low birth weight and develop more slowly, both cognitively and physically, than their same-age peers; and

**Whereas**, children with 4p-syndrome often experience adverse medical complications while still maintaining pleasant, loveable personalities; and

**Whereas**, professionals in the medical field are dedicated to further research of this extremely rare disease, its misdiagnosis, and exploration of new therapies to offer hope to persons with 4p-syndrome; and

**Whereas**, Wolf-Hirschhorn/4p-syndrome Awareness Day recognizes the families, individuals and caregivers impacted by 4p-syndrome and raises awareness regarding the importance of advocating for effective screenings, early intervention, and other necessary and critical treatments;

**Now, Therefore, I, Mary Fallin, Governor**, do hereby proclaim April 16, 2016, as

**“Wolf-Hirschhorn/4p-syndrome Awareness Day”**
