

Proclamation

Whereas, Tri-County Electric Cooperative (TCEC), headquartered in Hooker, Oklahoma, is a not-for-profit distribution cooperative owned and controlled by its members, which number over 20,000 households and businesses in the Oklahoma Panhandle, southwestern Kansas, the northern border of the Texas Panhandle and parts of Colorado and New Mexico; and

Whereas, TCEC provides its members with safe, reliable and affordable electric services and its staff oversees nearly 5,500 miles of transmission and distribution lines; and

Whereas, TCEC and Today's Power Inc. (TPI) have partnered to be the first utility in Oklahoma to offer its members a community solar energy option: TCEC Community Solar; and

Whereas, TCEC Community Solar provides a renewable energy option for TCEC members who want the benefits of solar power without the expense of researching, building and maintaining their own roof-top system; and

Whereas, it is fitting to recognize TCEC Community Solar for working to achieve sustainability, safe and affordable renewable energy while strengthening our economy through energy innovation;

Now, therefore, I, Mary Fallin, Governor, do hereby proclaim April 26, 2016, as

"Tri-County Electric Cooperative Community Solar Day"

in the state of Oklahoma.
