

Proclamation

Whereas, congenital disorders of glycosylation (CDG) are a group of rare metabolic disorders that affect normal organ and neurological system development, leaving sufferers impaired with significant physical and developmental disabilities; and

Whereas, CDG is severely under-diagnosed and misdiagnosed with approximately 1,000 cases identified globally and 150 cases currently reported in the United States; and

Whereas, diagnosis of CDG is important to ensure timely management of clinical complications, accessing specialized services, genetic counseling and treatment and/or therapeutic remedies; and


Whereas, Congenital Disorders of Glycosylation Awareness Day is dedicated to raising public awareness about this disease through education, informational activities and research;
