Senate Joint Resolution No. 8.

A Resolution Authorizing The Submission  
Of A Proposed Amendment To The  
Constitution To The People For Their  
Approval Or Rejection, For The Purpose  
Of Amending Section 2 Of Article 10,  
Limiting The School District Levy  
For The Support Of The Common  
Schools.

Be It Resolved By The Senate And House Of  
Representatives Of The Eighth Legislature Of The  
State Of Oklahoma In Regular Session Assembled:

That the State Election Board is hereby instructed to prepare and submit to the voters of this State for their adoption or rejection at the next general, or special election, the following proposed amendment to Section 9, of Article 10, of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma, and to read as follows:

"Sec. 9. Except as herein otherwise provided, the total taxes, on an ad valorem basis, for all purposes, State, County, Township, City or Town, and School District taxes, shall not exceed in any one year forty-one and one-half (41 1/2) mills on the dollar, to be divided as follows:

State levy, not more than three and one-half mills;  
County levy, not more than eight mills; provided, that any county may levy not exceeding two mills additional for county high school and aid to the common schools of the county, not over one mill of which shall be for such high school, and

the aid to said common schools shall be apportioned as provided by law; township levy, not more than five mills; city or town levy, not more than ten mills; school district levy, not more than fifteen (15) mills on the dollar for school district purposes, for support of common school: Provided, That the aforesaid annual rate for school purposes may be increased by any school district by an amount not to exceed ten mills on the dollar valuation, on condition that a majority of the voters thereof voting at an election vote for said increase.



The gist of the Proposition is:


TO AMEND SECTION NINE (9), ARTICLE TEN (10), OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA, SO THAT THE MAXIMUM OF THE TOTAL TAXES AUTHORIZED TO BE LEVIED ON AN AD VALOREM BASIS FOR ALL PURPOSES, STATE, COUNTY, TOWNSHIP, CITY OR TOWN AND SCHOOL DISTRICT TAXES WILL BE INCREASED FROM THIRTY-ONE (31) MILLS ON THE DOLLAR TO FORTY-ONE AND ONE-HALF (41½) MILLS, AND THE SCHOOL DISTRICT LEVY FROM FIVE (5) TO FIFTEEN (15) MILLS ON THE DOLLAR FOR SCHOOL PURPOSES FOR THE SUPPORT OF COMMON SCHOOLS.

STATE QUESTION No. 114

Referendum No. 40.

The gist of the Proposition is:

To amend Section 9, Article 10, of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma, so that the maximum of the total Taxes authorized to be levied on an ad valorem basis for all purposes, State, County, Township, City or Town and School District Taxes will be increased from Thirty-one (31) Mills on the Dollar to Forty-One and One-Half ( $41\frac{1}{2}$ ) Mills, and the School District Levy from Five (5) to Fifteen (15) Mills on the Dollar for School Purposes for the support of Common Schools.
