PETITION IN REFERENDUM

TO THE HONORABLE WILLIAM H. MURRAY, Governor of Oklahoma:

We, the undersigned citizens and legal voters of the State of Oklahoma, respectfully order that the House Bill No. 236 entitled:

"AN ACT AMENDING SECTION 12656, OKLAHOMA STATUTES 1931, RELATING TO THE DUTIES, POWERS AND AUTHORITY OF THE STATE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION; PROVIDING ADDITIONAL POWERS AND AUTHORITY AS TO EQUALIZATION AND ADJUSTMENT OF CERTAIN PROPERTY; AUTHORIZING THE OKLAHOMA TAX COMMISSION TO MAKE INVESTIGATIONS, HOLD HEARINGS AND MAKE ADDITIONAL FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS RELATING TO THE VALUATION AND EQUALIZATION OF PROPERTY SUBJECT TO AD VALOREM TAXATION; PROVIDING FOR FORMS FOR LISTING PROPERTY FOR AD VALOREM TAXATION; REQUIRING INFORMATION FROM LOCAL OFFICERS RELATING TO THE ASSESSMENT OF PROPERTY; PROVIDING FOR HEARINGS OF COUNTY OFFICIALS AND AGGRIEVED TAXPAYERS; REPEALING CONFLICTING LAWS."

Passed by the Fourteenth session of the Legislature of the State of Oklahoma, at the regular session of said Legislature, shall be referred to the people of the state, for their approval or rejection at the next regular election held throughout the State or at a special election to be called hereon by the Governor of the State of Oklahoma, and each for himself says: I have personally signed this petition; I am a legal voter of the State of Oklahoma, and my residence and postoffice address are correctly written after my name.

Referendum petitions shall be filed with the Secretary of State not more than ninety days after the final adjournment of the session of the Legislature which passed the bill on which the referendum is demanded.

The question we herewith submit to our fellow voters is: "SHALL THE FOLLOWING BILL OF THE LEGISLATURE BE VETOED?"





That I, R. A. Sneed, Secretary of the State of Oklahoma, did on this, the 19th day of July, 1933, receive of Fred L. Patrick and Jesse C. Todd, in the presence of Fred L. Patrick ^{and Jesse C. Todd} citizens and legal voters of the State of Oklahoma and proponents of the Referendum Petition hereinafter described, and did file in my office as required by law, certain petitions containing approximately 82,641 names of petitioners ordering that House Bill No. 236, passed by the Fourteenth Session of the Legislature of Oklahoma at its regular session, entitled
