BALLOT TITLE.

STATE QUESTION NO. ____

Proposed by Legislature.

The purpose of this measure is to amend the Constitution of Oklahoma by adopting in lieu of Section Nine, of Article Nine, a new section authorizing railroad companies, transportation and transmission companies, organized under the laws of Oklahoma, to consolidate with like companies organized under the laws of any other state, or of the United States, but providing that such companies, shall not thereby become foreign corporations, and providing further that the state courts of Oklahoma, shall retain jurisdiction in all controversies that may arise, as though the consolidation had not taken place.
