6 A JOINT RESOLUTION PROPOSING AN AMEND-
7 MENT TO ARTICLE 13 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF
8 OKLAHOMA; AND PROVIDING FOR A BOARD OF
9 REGENTS FOR THE OKLAHOMA MILITARY ACADEMY.

10 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE OF
11 THE TWENTY-SECOND LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

12 SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people
13 for their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by
14 law, at the first Special or General Election, the following pro-
15 posed amendment to Article 13 of the Constitution of Oklahoma, same
16 to be Section 9, Article 13 of the Constitution of Oklahoma:

17 Section 9. The government of the Oklahoma Military Academy
18 shall be vested in a Board of Regents consisting of five (5) members
19 to be appointed by the Governor by and with the advice and consent
20 of the Senate. One (1) member shall be appointed for a term expir-
21 ing June 30, 1951, and one (1) each for terms ending respectively
22 one (1), two (2), three (3) and four (4) years thereafter. Upon the
23 expiration of any of said terms a successor shall be appointed for a
24 term of five (5) years. Appointments for filling a vacancy in said
25 Board shall be made by the Governor by and with the advice and consent
26 of the Senate, and such appointment shall be for the residue of the
27 term only. The Board of Regents of the Oklahoma Military Academy
28 shall continue to function as such under existing Statutes until a
29 legal quorum of three (3) members of the Board of Regents created
30 herein shall have been appointed, confirmed and qualified. Members
31 of said Board shall be subject to removal from office only as provid-
32 ed by law for the removal of elective officers not subject to impeach-
33 ment.

E. McPherrren, one of the proponents of said petition, and from said examination the Attorney General finds that said ballot title is not in legal form and in harmony with the law.
