

A JOINT RESOLUTION PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO SECTION 21, ARTICLE V, OKLAHOMA CONSTITUTION, RELATING TO THE COMPENSATION AND EXPENSES OF MEMBERS OF THE LEGISLATURE; AND PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION OF THE AMENDMENT TO THE PEOPLE FOR THEIR APPROVAL OR REJECTION AT A SPECIAL ELECTION.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND SENATE OF THE TWENTY-SEVENTH LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law, the following proposed amendment to Section 21, Article V of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma:

Section 21. Members of the Legislature shall receive monthly salaries of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for their services during their term of office regardless of when their term commences or expires, and they shall receive Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) per diem for not to exceed seventy-five (75) legislative days during the regular or special session of the Legislature, and ten cents per mile for every mile of necessary travel for not to exceed eight (8) trips in going to and returning from the place of meeting of the Legislature, on the most usual route and shall receive no other compensation.

SECTION 2. The ballot title for said proposed amendment shall be in the following form:

THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:

Shall a Constitutional Amendment

Amending Section 21, Article V, Constitution of Oklahoma,

by providing that members of the Legislature shall receive

monthly salaries of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for their services during their term of office regardless of when their term commences or expires, and they shall receive Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) per diem for not to exceed seventy-five (75) legislative days during the regular or special session of the Legislature, and ten cents per mile for every mile of necessary travel for not to exceed eight (8) trips in going to and returning from the place of meeting of the Legislature, on the most usual route and shall receive no other compensation.

SECTION 3. The Speaker of the House shall, immediately after the effective date of this Resolution, prepare and file one (1) copy thereof, including said ballot title, with the Secretary of State and one (1) copy with the Attorney General.

SECTION 4. A special election is hereby ordered to be held throughout the State on the date of the next ensuing special election held throughout the State, or on the date of the next ensuing State-wide primary election, whichever is the earlier, at which the proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma, set forth in Section 1 of this Resolution shall be submitted to the people of Oklahoma for their approval or rejection as and in the manner provided by law.

You are hereby notified that pursuant to the discretion and duty lodged in and imposed upon the Attorney General by 34 O. S. 1951 § 9, he has examined the proposed ballot title to Enrolled House Joint Resolution No. 519 of the Regular Session of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Oklahoma, which, together with a copy of said resolution, was delivered to him on May 28, 1959, by the Honorable Clint Livingston, Speaker of the House of Representatives, and from said examination finds that said ballot title is not in legal form and in harmony with the law. The Attorney General, therefore, submits the following ballot title, same being in legal form and in harmony with the law:

THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:

Shall a Constitutional Amendment

Amending Section 21, Article V, Constitution of Oklahoma; providing that members of Legislature shall receive monthly salaries of \$200.00 during their term of office regardless of when their term commences or expires, and receive \$15.00 per diem for not to exceed 75 legislative days during regular or special session of Legislature, and ten cents per mile for every mile of necessary travel for not to exceed 8 trips in going to and returning from the place of meeting of Legislature, on most usual route and shall receive no other compensation,

be approved by the people?

Inasmuch as 34 O. S. 1951 § 9, supra, expressly provides that

"no appeal shall be allowed as to ballot titles of constitutional or legislative enactments proposed by the Legislature which ballot titles have been approved or revised by the Attorney General.",

it is your duty, under the provisions of said section, to immediately

"transmit to the Secretary of the State Election Board an attested copy of the pending proposition, including such approved title."
