15 FOR A BALLOT TITLE; AND ORDERING A SPECIAL
16 ELECTION.

17 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND SENATE OF THE
18 2ND SESSION OF THE 32ND LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

19 SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people
20 for their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by
21 law, the question, pursuant specifically to Section 2, Article XXIV,
22 of the Oklahoma Constitution, of calling a Constitutional Convention
23 which shall be authorized to propose alterations, revisions, or
24 amendments to the Constitution, or to propose a new Constitution
25 for the State of Oklahoma.

26 SECTION 2. The ballot title for the proposed question set
27 forth in Section 1 shall be in the following form:




2 SECTION 3. The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall,


