To the Honorable C. N. Haskell, Governor of Oklahoma:

We, the undersigned citizens and legal voters of the State of Oklahoma, County of respectfully order that the following law shall be submitted to the legal voters of the State of Oklahoma for their approval or rejection at the regular election to be held on the first Tuesday succeeding the first Monday of November, A. D., 1910, being the eighth day of said month, or at the next election held throughout the State, or at any special election which the Governor of the State may call for such purpose at which the same may be submitted, and each for himself says: I have personally signed this petition, and am a legal voter of the State of Oklahoma, and of

the County of; my residence and post office are correctly written after my name. The time for filing this petition expires nine months from the first day of April, A. D. 1909. The question we herewith submit to our fellow voters is: Shall the following Bill be adopted, to-wit:




