TITLE 14-Congressional and Legislative Districts, Chapter 1-Congressional Districts, Section _:
Standards for drawing and establishing U.S. Congressional District and Oklahoma Senate and House Legislative District Boundaries.

No Oklahoma State Legislative District or U.S. Congressional District within Oklahoma shall be enacted or affirmed which fails to satisfy these standards by classification (class) of district.

A. In result, the number of voters in each electoral subdivision shall be as nearly equal in population as is practicable.

B. Exterior Boundaries shall be drawn with equal priority to each of the following three standards:

- a. Political Neutrality: The result shall not favor or disfavor any political party, incumbent or challenger;
- b. Equal Opportunity: The result shall not deny or abridge equal opportunity of racial and language minorities nor diminish their ability to elect representatives of their choice;
- c. Contiguity: The result shall consist of contiguous territory;

C. To the extent practicable after having met the foregoing standards, districts shall be compact with minimal perimeters, utilizing existing geographical and political subdivision boundaries.

- a. No municipality shall be divided into more than one district of the same class except to satisfy sections A or B. If a municipality must be divided into more than one district within the same class then (1) the municipality shall be divided the fewest times possible, and (2) distinct population groups and common communities of interest shall be preserved.
- b. No county shall be divided into more than one district of the same class except to satisfy sections A or B. If a county must be divided into more than one district within the same class, then (1) the county shall be divided the fewest times possible, and (2) distinct population groups and common communities of interest shall be preserved.

D. The Oklahoma Legislature shall reapportion each classification of district using these standards by May 31, 2013.

E. Any existing law in conflict herewith shall be interpreted to conform herewith.

F. This law shall become effective when approved by the voters, and shall apply to any districting in process.



Dear Secretary Coffee:

In accordance with the provisions of 34 O.S.Supp.2010, § 9(D), please be advised that we have reviewed the proposed Ballot Title for the above-referenced State Question and conclude that it does not comply with applicable laws for the following reasons, to-wit:

1. It does not adequately explain the **effect** of the proposition as, among other things:
 - It does not explain that the initiative establishes standards to be applied to existing redistricting processes;
 - It does not explain that the Legislature is to reapportion each district using these standards by May 31, 2013, outside the ten-year redistricting process;
 - It does not explain that the standards are to be applied to achieve electoral subdivisions of nearly equal population;
 - It does not explain the priorities to be achieved by application of the standards;
 - It does not explain that districts are to be drawn using existing boundaries when practicable;
 - It does not explain how municipalities and counties are to be divided.
2. It is not written on the eighth-grade reading comprehension level.
3. It contains language which has a special meaning not commonly known to the citizen of this state.



Having found that the proposed ballot title for the above referenced state question did not comply with applicable laws, we have, in accordance with the provisions of 34 O.S.Supp.2010, § 9(D), prepared the following Ballot Title. As a Title 34 Ballot Title review, the following does not constitute an Attorney General Opinion on the merits or constitutionality of the underlying proposed changes in the law. NOTICE OF THE FILING OF STATE QUESTION NUMBER 760, INITIATIVE PETITION NUMBER 394

NOTICE is hereby given that on September 7, 2011, State Question Number 760, Initiative Petition Number 394 was filed in the Office of the Secretary of State. The petition appears on its face to sufficiently meet the statutory requirements for filing with the Office of the Secretary. The Ballot Title, as rewritten by the Attorney General pursuant to state statutes, states:

This measure adds a new Section of law to Title 14. It requires that United States congressional districts be redrawn by May 31, 2013. It also requires that state Senate and House districts be redrawn by May 31, 2013.

District lines were redrawn in 2011. This was done to follow current law requiring redrawing every ten years following the federal census. This measure changes the law to require an additional redrawing outside the ten-year cycle.

Under current law, the primary goal in drawing districts is to achieve equal population. This measure changes current law. It requires, in addition to equal population, that districts be drawn to give equal priority to three new standards. These standards are political neutrality, equal opportunity and borders that connect.

The measure allows dividing cities and counties to meet these requirements. If possible, districts shall be compact and shall be drawn using existing boundaries. Districts shall divide cities and counties as few times as possible.

The measure provides that, unless necessary, districts shall not divide "distinct population groups." Districts shall also not divide "common communities of interest." The measure does not define these terms.
