“WARNING”

“It is a felony for anyone to sign an initiative or referendum petition with any name other than his own, or knowingly to sign his name more than once for the measure, or to sign such petition when he is not a legal voter.”

INITIATIVE PETITION

To the Honorable Mary Fallin, Governor of Oklahoma:

We, the undersigned legal voters of the State of Oklahoma, respectfully order that the following proposed amendment to the constitution shall be submitted to the legal voters of the State of Oklahoma for their approval or rejection at the regular general election to be held on the 1st day of November, 2016, and each for himself says: I have personally signed this petition; I am a legal voter of the State of Oklahoma; my residence or post office are correctly written after my name. The time for filing this petition expires ninety days from September 15th, 2014. The question we herewith submit to our fellow voters is: Shall the following proposed amendment to the Constitution be approved?

BALLOT TITLE

“...To secure just and rightful government...”--Preamble to the Oklahoma Constitution
“All political power is inherent in the people...”--Bill of Rights of the Oklahoma Constitution

...In ascent thereto, this measure amends the Oklahoma Constitution--the Legislature, in prescribing the time and manner of holding and conducting all elections, shall include and not be contrary to the following provision: elector’s choice(s) in an election shall not be anonymous--but rather those choice(s) shall be correlated with reference identifying such election, the elector’s full name, and the elector’s resident precinct/locale--this correlation shall then be made available to the public on a continuous basis as an open public record within thirty-one (31) calendar days after such election.

The effect of the proposition is as follows:

If choices are public also therefore is a person's stand; to stand in public is to invite argument, to risk disagreement, and to engender the possibility of standing with others (“political power”). Society cannot allow itself to be held hostage to an ethos of secrecy, silence, and misdirection: malevolence as an all-powerful but apparently authorless entity; rather than confrontation and exposure, a descent into silent reserve and privileged gossip is a perilous destiny (i.e., extractive institutions--industries of violence).

Even as individual private rights safeguard a sphere in which private persons are absolved of the obligation to account publicly for everything they do, the exercise of any political function (either as an elector or as a representative) is the exercise of power over another, and as such rather than being an individual private right, exercised and justified privately (secret ballot public record voting), is an individual public right, exercised and justified publicly (open ballot public record voting); such obligation--if of a sphere and principal in governance thereto, safeguarding an ethos that the exercise of power over another be just (“just and rightful government”).

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA THAT AN AMENDED SECTION 4 OF ARTICLE 3 OF THE OKLAHOMA CONSTITUTION BE APPROVED:

Article 3, Section 4:

Manner of holding and conducting elections - Registration of electors.

The Legislature shall prescribe the time and manner of holding and conducting all elections to include and not be contrary to the following provision: elector's choice(s) in an election shall not be anonymous--but rather those choice(s) shall be correlated with reference identifying such election, the elector's full name, and the elector's resident precinct/locale--this correlation shall then be made available to the public on a continuous basis as an open public record within thirty-one (31) calendar days after such election, and the Legislature shall enact such laws as may be necessary to detect and punish fraud in all elections. The Legislature may provide by law for the registration of electors throughout the state and, when it is so provided, no person shall vote at any election unless he shall have registered according to law.



Re: Ballot Title for State Question No. 775, Initiative Petition No. 401

In accordance with the provisions of 34 O.S.2011, § 9(D), we have reviewed the proposed Ballot Title for the above-referenced State Question and conclude that it does not comply with applicable laws for the following reasons:

1. It contains confusing language promoting the measure rather than making clear, in basic words, that the proposition amends the Constitution to require that records of how individual voters voted in all elections be made available to the public.
2. It reflects partiality in its composition and contains language in support of the measure.
3. It exceeds two hundred (200) words.

Having found that the Ballot Title does not comply with applicable laws, we will, in accordance with the provisions of 34 O.S.2011, § 9(D), within ten (10) business days, prepare a Ballot Title which complies with the law.






