Notices of Rulemaking Intent

Prior to adoption and gubernatorial/legislative review of a proposed PERMANENT rulemaking action, an agency must publish a Notice of Rulemaking Intent in the *Register*. In addition, an agency may publish a Notice of Rulemaking Intent in the *Register* prior to adoption of a proposed EMERGENCY or PREEMPTIVE rulemaking action.

When the chapter was originally codified in 2011, it was based largely on the standards for sexual assault services in 75 OAC 15. After careful review, the Domestic Violence & Sexual Assault Advisory Council recommended that the Attorney General amend the current chapter to more specifically meet the needs of victims of human sex trafficking and their children. These amendments include: stressing the importance of client safety and confidentiality, reflecting the clients' right to self-determination, incorporating definitions that were unintentionally omitted from the chapter, redefining core services and orientation training to more accurately meet the needs of human sex trafficking survivors and requiring programs to conduct an annual employee name search against the Sex Offenders Registration Act and the Mary Rippy Violence Crime Offenders Registration Act.

SUMMARY:

The Secretary of the State Election Board proposes amendments in Subchapter 3 and 5 of Chapter 15 to clarify the requirements set out in the Oklahoma Statutes for signatures on voter registration applications.

In 2014, an organization promoting voter registration and participation provided an online voter registration application that a user could sign electronically using remote pen technology. Remote pen technology allows an applicant to "sign" a document by making the motions of a signature with a finger or a stylus on the screen of an electronic device such as a tablet or smart phone. The signature motions are transmitted to a machine that imitates the motions with an actual pen and wet ink to reproduce the signature on a printed copy of the document.

When the use of remote pen technology came to light, the Secretary of the State Election Board requested an opinion from the Oklahoma Attorney General to determine whether remote pen technology complies with provisions of Title 26 O.S., Section 4-112(A) requiring that the applicant's signature on a voter registration application "must be the original, handwritten signature, autograph or mark of the applicant." The law further states that "No facsimile, reproduction, typewritten or other substitute signature, autograph or mark will be valid."

The Attorney General's official opinion (2014-10) stated that remote pen technology does not produce an "original, handwritten signature," and therefore is not a valid means of signing a voter registration application in Oklahoma. The proposed amendments in Chapter 15 are intended to emphasize the requirements in the statutes.

The Secretary of the State Election Board proposes a new Section in Subchapter 5 of Chapter 30 to address online absentee ballot application tools.

Online absentee ballot application tools operated by private entities proliferated during the 2014 election cycle, and the State Election Board staff fielded many questions, complaints, and concerns about these application sources. Anecdotal reports indicate that some operators of such online application tools may have delayed transmitting the applications to appropriate election officials in time to meet deadlines and may not have transmitted all such applications produced by their online tool if the applications were deemed incomplete or invalid. Voters, of course, believed they had submitted valid applications in a timely and secure manner and complained to election officials upon discovery that their applications either were never received or were received too late to be processed and for ballots to be issued.

Therefore, the Secretary plans to provide a secure, online absentee ballot application tool, accessible from the State Election Board website by any registered voter, that will enable voters to complete and submit timely and valid applications

for absentee ballots and that also ensures such applications are received and processed by the appropriate County Election Boards. Any candidate, political organization, advocacy group, or other entity interested in encouraging voter participation through absentee voting may link to the State Election Board's online absentee application tool.

An initial inspection fee has been added to defray the cost and expenses of the LP Gas Administration inspecting the initial installation of the unattended LP Gas motor fuel dispenser station. An annual inspection fee has also been proposed to defray the cost and expense of an annual safety inspection of the dispenser station. There are also a couple of nonsubstantive amendments to clean up grammar/spelling and/or improve sentence structure.

The proposed amendments to 420:10-1-14 add new language that would require plans be submitted by a Class I permit holder on any dispenser, including the unattended self-service LP Gas motor fuel dispenser stations, to be approved by the LP Gas Administration. The plan review fee charged by the LP Gas Administration has been increased from \$10.00 to \$100.00. Also, updates and clarifies how DOT cylinders are to be charged. The proposed amendment also deletes the requirement that a cylinder exchange cabinet be located with a minimum five (5) feet distance away from any source of ignition. The rule instead defers to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Pamphlet 58 as to the location requirements of the cabinet.
